Preamble

Recently there have been certain organizations that have been using funding from countries we do not consider to be allies to influence their countries elections. This influence can negatively impact the relations between Israel and said countries as organizations that claim to be pro-Israel help put people into power that may not have Israel's best interests at heart. Because these organizations claim to be pro-Israel the citizens of that country assume that these organizations are advocating on behalf of Israel and that have Israels support. Examples of this include such organizations claiming our latest actions are undemocratic We cannot allow this to continue as it contaminates the Diasporas view of what we as a Knesset define to be pro-Israel and the issue needs to be addressed swiftly.

<u>Body</u>

SECTION 1: These Organizations claim to be Pro-Israel and yet are not

SUB-SECTION 1: Recently, international lobbyist organizations, which declare themselves as pro-Israel have been exhibiting an agenda that contradicts the majority opinion of the Knesset at this time. Any organization that does not support the decisions of the government, and therefore the majority opinion of the Knesset, should not be considered pro-Israel.

SUB-SECTION 2: The Diaspora committee reserves the exclusive right to determine which organizations are or are not pro-Israel by a majority vote where all members of the committee vote. A committee member may not abstain from voting under any circumstances.

SECTION 2: Any organization that receives funding from a country that Israel doesn't not consider to be an ally cannot claim to be pro-Israel

SUB-SECTION 2: If these countries truly had Israel's best interests in mind then they would openly support Israel and not just support organizations that claim to be 'pro-Israel'. By having this requirement it ensures that any organization that claims to be pro-Israel is in fact pro-Israel and isn't being influenced by countries that are not willing to support Israel themselves.

SECTION 3: By claiming to be pro-Israel these organizations are directly impacting the Diaspora

SUB-SECTION 3: We don't want these organizations directly impacting Israel's relationship with other countries because it will poison Israel's relations with the Diaspora.

SECTION 4: Any member of the Israeli government cannot directly or indirectly support an organization that Israel does not consider to be pro-Israel

SUB-SECTION 4: By having the Israeli government openly refuse to support organizations that claim to be pro-Israel we are clearly showing to the countries in which the organizations are based that their views do not reflect those of Israel.

Enactment Clause

This bill would go into effect 30 days after being passed by the Knesset.
