

In 1947, Peshawar, riots against Jews broke out because of the UN vote to partition Palestine and create a Jewish State. Bilhah Mirzoeff was a victim. She was buried in Peshawar on condition that she be reburied in Israel. The surviving family resettled in Bombay, India and later in Israel, where Bilhah's remains were put to rest in 1967.
