### 1. Stay far away from a bad neighbor.



**A PERSON IS INFLUENCED BY HIS SURROUNDINGS!!**

*Who, me?! Influenced?*

**YES!! This applies to every single person!**



Rav Chaim Pinchas Scheinberg (1910–2012) זצ"ל, was a צדיק who was raised in America and learned Torah in the Mir Yeshiva of pre-war Europe, and was the ראש ישיבה of Yeshivas Torah Ohr in ירושלים.

Rav Scheinberg once made a קידוש that no one knew the reason for, so some students asked him what the occasion was. He replied that whenever someone mentioned that the Yankees won a game, he felt a tiny bit happy to hear that. Just recently someone mentioned that the Yankees won the World Series, and he didn't have even the slightest feeling of happiness. Being a fan of the sports team of his American childhood was "out of his system".

The Rosh Yeshiva taught that *from this, we can learn how strongly our surroundings have an influence on us!*

*This message came from someone who was a Gadol HaDor, a giant in Torah who was the Rosh HaYeshiva of a prestigious yeshiva, and had been living in Mattersdorf, an area in Yerushalayim comprised of בני עליה – a community of people highly dedicated to Torah – for close to 50 years!!*

### 2. Don't become friendly with a "Rasha".

**Rasha:** someone who intentionally rebels against Hashem's Torah.

*Why should you stay away from such a person?*

*Maybe you could influence him to behave properly?!*

Once upon a time, a father and son were walking in the forest. The son walked ahead, but then, the father saw that his son was approaching a bear, and so he told his son to quickly come back!
