Israeli Art Masters Shai Azoulay (1971-)

Introduction to the Artist:

Azoulay, a graduate of Bezalel Academy of Art and Design, lives and works in Jerusalem. Azoulay was influenced by Rabbi Nachman's religious philosophy which focuses on closeness to God. To Azoulay, believes in looking inward and finding time to "speak to God...It is a chance to be sad, to fix yourself, to set goals and wishes." As he walks through nature he examines himself and the world around him and speaks to God. Shai Azoulay's paintings, many inspired by Matisse, reflect his own spiritual experiences. Bold color, energy and exuberance are essential in his painting. The recurring desert landscape has biographical significance. Many religious symbols and references to Jewish ritual are found in his work. Azoulay was inspired by other artists and combined these influences his own experiences.
